# April 4th - Sunken Steamboats of Moosehead Lake

A Documentary Film Project

The North Shore Frogmen hosted Ryan Robbins, who presented on the documentary film project, "Sunken Steamboats of Moosehead Lake." This film project is currently in production, under the guidance of director Ryan Robbins, in partnership with the Moosehead Marine Museum and Moosehead Lake Divers, with the support of the Moosehead Historical Society.



This presentation was very well attended by Froggies, guests, and families. Thank you Ray for providing the snacks. During the meeting we also celebrated a happy 75<sup>th</sup> birthday for Dodie Carvalho....happy birthday Dodie!!!

Ryan grew up on the shores of Moosehead Lake, and witnessed the restoration of the steamship Katahdin. His curiosity was seeded when he was invited aboard to watch the work being done and hearing stories of the old steamships, the great Mount Kineo resort, and the realization that this remote area was once the edge of civilization where the wealthy and sometimes famous came to play. After moving away to go to school and start a career, Ryan was able to take up SCUBA diving with the primary goal of fulfilling his childhood dream of seeing what the lake was hiding underwater. Upon surfacing from his very first Moosehead Lake dive on the Kineo steamer remain and feeling like Jacques Cousteau of the great north woods, he

realized he wanted to use his skills to share with others the excitement of seeing what lies below. As he puts it, "real history you can see and touch exists on the bottom of Moosehead Lake."

To think you could take a train from Boston, New York, or other big cities beyond and be dropped off in the middle of the wilderness, several hundred miles from anywhere...right at the water's edge of Moosehead Lake, then take a steamboat to a grand 600-guest resort hotel in the midst of the Maine woods. In 1900 you could do this. Thousands of people escaped from the hustle, bustle, and heat of the cities to the wilderness of the Moosehead

Lake Region – for the same reasons they do today. Now imagine over 25 steamboats cruising Moosehead Lake ferrying tourists, sportsmen, businessmen, and cargo, or even towing logs. What happened to all of them? While we can't go back in time, we can visit the underwater remains of the steamboats, show their history, and tell the stories of those whose lives were impacted. By combining high-definition underwater video, interviews, and historic images, this historical documentary tells the real-life tale of three sunken steamboats and what happened to them, while also providing an overview of steam-boating history on Moosehead Lake. # May 18th - NSF Canoe and Kayak Day on the Ipswich River

The NSF is scheduling a day of canoeing or kayaking at 9:00 AM on the Ipswich River from a drop-off point on route 97 to the Willowdale Dam. This is about a 4 hour trip but will usually take longer at a leisurely pace and with a stop for lunch about 2 hours from the dam. The voyage takes us through a National Audubon Wildlife Sanctuary, scenic wetlands, the Bradley Palmer State Park, and Willowdale State Forest. Many birds, turtles, and frogs can be seen along the way. Swimming is also available. We meet at Foote Brothers Canoe and Kayak Rental, which is located at the Willowdale Dam, 230 Topsfield Rd., Ipswich, 978-356-9771. Canoe or kayak rental is \$45, but a canoe will carry at least 2 people and more equipment. Foote brothers will transport private canoes or kayaks for \$15. We will have at least 1 grill so bring something to grill for lunch if you wish. Recommended items to bring are insect repellent, sunscreen, hat, clothing that dries quickly and is appropriate for the weather, windbreaker, water or other drinks, food, camera, pfd (supplied if you're renting a canoe or kayak), coolers, dry bags, and perhaps extra dry cloths. Foote Brothers opens at 8 am. A waiver must be filled out and can either be filled out that day or downloaded as a pdf file ahead of time.
